## Need a COVID test?

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW



**Whether you are feeling symptoms of COVID-19 or have been exposed to COVID-19, you have options.**

The Virginia Department of Health (VDH) provides a list of COVID-19 testing sites based on your location. CVS, Rite Aid, Walgreens and other local pharmacies offer drive-thru and at-home COVID-19 testing kits. Visit [VDH online](#) to determine which location is most convenient for you.

- **Minor Illness or Injury**
- Fever/Flu
- Cold/Cough
- Sprains & Joint Pain
- Ear Ache
- Skin Conditions (*rash/bruises*)
- Urinary Tract Infection
- Wellness Visit
- Sports Physicals

### URGENT CARE | VIDEO VISIT

- **Non-Life Threatening Injury**
- Broken Bones (*not protruding*)
- Minor Infections
- Sprains, Cuts
- Sore Throat
- Burns (*minor*)

### EMERGENCY CARE

- **Life Threatening or Severe Injury**
- Breathing Difficulties
- Traumatic Injuries
- Head Injury
- Chest Pain / Heart Attack
- Stroke
- Severe Allergic Reaction
- Deep Wounds
- Broken Bones (*bone protruding*)
- Severe Abdominal Pain (*vomiting/diarrhea*)
